



Subject: Killer wet fly action on the Gunnison

I got a tip that there was good caddis action on the lower gunnison in the evening .The weather was uncertain with thunderstorms in the forecast. I started fishing dry dropper and caught a few fish. On one drift the fly was swinging in the current and I caught a good Rainbow. I figured it was time to switch to wets . The wind was unbelievable but I managed some medium casts.. I got hits right away. Here is the interesting part. I caught fish in three different style drifts. Early in the evening I caught the majority of the fish on the dangle. As the hatch progressed I caught fish leading my flies across the current without any bend or tension loop in my presentation. During the last stage I was successful with across stream short dead drift presentation. I lost count of the number of fish but I know it was well above 30 fish in a couple of hours., In the count were several Rainbows in the 20 inch range and several browns above 18 inches. I got off the river just before dark. There was a crowd of fishermen waiting for me. They all wanted to know how I caught so many fish when they were getting skunked, I gave full credit to you and Davy for getting me going on wet flies and told them to buy Davy,s video. This was fast current wet fly fishing. I was amazed how aggressively the fish attacked my presentations. I used mostly soft hackles but I did manage a few on a hares ear wet fly.

Biggest Day of Fly Fishing in the History of Shreveport/Bossier!

Wow, what an amazing weekend with Dave Whitlock. I must say, the workshop exceeded my expectations. I have come to realize, that there is always something new in the world of fly fishing. Dave Whitlock, almost 80 years old, was an incredible example of not only how to be a great fly fisherman, but how to enter the later stage of life not only with grace, but with vigor. This man was simply amazing. For example: He wanted to see the boat ramp at the refuge. We drove to the gate at the ramp and found that it was locked. When I told him I would call and have it opened he said "What for? Gates were made for climbing!". He then jumped out of my truck and climbed the 5 foot fence, then took off his shoes and jogged down to the boat ramp 100 yards away.

While I was impressed with his balance standing up in a jon boat to give a casting demonstration, I was equally impressed with the speed in which he threaded a needle with a tippet and with his steady hands when tying flies.

Oh did I mention, I learned some cool stuff. The importance of keeping the rod tip down and lifting the line off the water to cast (Dave never made a false cast), The importance of the knotless leader, and how it can eliminate 75% of the tangles you get when casting. I was amazed with his techniques with sink tip line. This workshop was custom tailored for the lakes and rivers we fish right here in the Ark-la-tex.

It was impressive to see so many of our new members at the workshop. Even more impressive was the number of people that drove over 250 miles to attend the event. Half of the people in attendance were from other cities. I want to thank Tom Bullock who had the vision to bring Dave Whitlock to Shreveport/Bossier. Tom had confidence in our club membership to support this event. I applaud the whole board of the NLFF for having the courage to step out and host such a premier event. These things take money, time, and planning. The board and many members responded in a great way.






10TH ANNUAL CONTRABAND FLY FISHING EXPO

If not, extra tools and vises are available. All that is needed is you!
