fishing, he would sit down in his remote cabin to chronicle his experiences.

Almost 25 years later, Rolf Nylinder with Peter Christensen along to document their journey, set out

to fish those very same waters. They lose their way in the thick back woods but stumble upon one of New Zealand's many remote cabins - and Lars' journal. Rolf's ever-growing interest in the journal becomes more and more obsessive. After returning home, they decide to return the journal to Lars, but what will happen when the two fly

fishers finally meet? Now Lars Lenth, Rolf Nylinder and Peter Christensen are real people and play themselves in "Only the River Knows". But I think only the river knows if the journal was actually real! The film has two parallel stories. One is the documentary of Rolf's journey captured by his friend Peter in the typical handheld and shaky style of an amateur cinematographer. The other is of a young Lars - played beautifully by actor Mikkel Poppelhøg (himself an avid fly fisherman) as chronicled in the journal.
